Dear Parents,

ECA firmly believes in the importance of developing a life-long interest in reading in our students. The benefits of becoming an active, fluent reader include greater success in school through improved literacy, development of higher-order thinking skills, and habit of connecting one's life experiences to the experiences of others. In order to encourage and foster the habit of reading, ECA has developed an Elementary Summer Reading Contest.

### 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade

- Each student should read with their parents if they are not yet readers or to their parents if they are able to, a minimum of eight (8) hours, one (1) hour per week, but can read as many hours as they desire. They can also use books on tape or CD to complete their hours of reading.
- These books can be in English or their mother tongue, because the idea is that they continue to enjoy reading with their parents.
- Parents will be given a reading log where they can keep track of the books that they have read with their children.
- At the beginning of the next school year (August 2010) each student will turn in their reading log and the total of books will be tallied.

### Prizes

- Each student who meets the minimum requirement will receive a prize.
- The student in each class who reads the most will receive a prize.
- The class that reads 140 books (PK and KG), 140 hours (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>) or 200 hours (3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>) will receive a class prize.
- The class that reads the most books or hours total will receive a class prize.
